AMENDMENT intended to be proposed by Ms. COLLINS (for herself, Mrs. SHAHEEN, and Mr. CASEY)

- At the end of subtitle C of title XII, add the fol-
- 2 lowing:
- SEC. 1243. MAN-PORTABLE AIR-DEFENSE SYSTEMS ORIGI-
- NATING FROM LIBYA.
- (a) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—Pursuant to section 11 5
- of the Department of State Authorities Act of 2006 (22
- U.S.C. 2349bb-6), the following is the policy of the United
- States: 8
- (1) To reduce and mitigate, to the greatest ex-9
- tent feasible, the threat posed to United States citi-10

1	zens and citizens of allies of the United States by
2	man-portable air-defense systems (MANPADS) that
3	were in Libya as of March 19, 2011.
4	(2) To seek the cooperation of, and to assist,
5	the Government of Libya and governments of neigh-
6	boring countries and other countries (as determined
7	by the President) to secure, remove, or eliminate
8	stocks of man-portable air-defense systems described
9	in paragraph (1) that pose a threat to United States
10	citizens and citizens of allies of the United States.
11	(3) To pursue, as a matter of priority, an
12	agreement with the Government of Libya and gov-
13	ernments of neighboring countries and other coun-
14	tries (as determined by the Secretary of State) to
15	formalize cooperation with the United States to limit
16	the availability, transfer, and proliferation of man-
17	portable air-defense systems described in paragraph
18	(1).
19	(b) Intelligence Community Assessment on
20	
21	(1) IN GENERAL.—The Director of National In-
22	telligence shall submit to the appropriate committees
23	of Congress an assessment by the intelligence com-
24	munity that accounts for the disposition of, and the
25	threat to United States citizens and citizens of allies

1	of the United States posed by man-portable air-de-
2	fense systems that were in Libya as of March 19,
3	2011. The assessment shall be submitted as soon as
4	practicable, but not later than the end of the 45-day
5	period beginning on the date of the enactment of
6	this Act.
7	(2) ELEMENTS.—The assessment submitted
8	under this subsection shall include the following:
9	(A) An estimate of the number of man-
10	portable air-defense systems that were in Libya
11	as of March 19, 2011.
12	(B) An estimate of the number of man-
13	portable air-defense systems in Libya as of
14	March 19, 2011, that are currently in the se-
15	cure custody of the Government of Libya, the
16	United States, an ally of the United States, a
17	member of the North Atlantic Treaty Organiza-
18	tion (NATO), or the United Nations.
19	(C) An estimate of the number of man-
20	portable air-defense systems in Libya as of
21	March 19, 2011, that were destroyed, disabled,
22	or otherwise rendered unusable during Oper-
23	ation Unified Protector and since the end of
24	Operation Unified Protector.

1	(D) An assessment of the number of man-
2	portable air-defense systems that is the dif-
3	ference between the number of man-portable
4	air-defense systems in Libya as of March 19,
5	2011, and the cumulative number of man-port-
6	able air-defense systems accounted for under
7	subparagraphs (B) and (C), and the current
8	disposition and locations of such man-portable
9	air-defense systems.
10	(E) An assessment of the number of man-
11	portable air-defense systems that are currently
12	in the custody of militias in Libya.
13	(F) A list of any organizations designated
14	as terrorist organizations by the Department of
15	State, or affiliate organizations or members of
16	such organizations, that are known or believed
17	to have custody of any man-portable air-defense
18	systems that were in the custody of the Govern-
19	ment of Libya as of March 19, 2011.
20	(G) An assessment of the threat posed to
21	United States citizens and citizens of allies of
22	the United States from unsecured man-portable
23	air-defense systems (as defined in section 11 of
24	the Department of State Authorities Act of

2006) originating from Libya.

1	(H) An assessment of the effect of the pro-
2	liferation of man-portable air-defense systems
3	that were in Libya as of March 19, 2011, on
4	the price and availability of man-portable air-
5	defense systems that are on the global arms
6	market.
7	(3) NOTICE REGARDING DELAY IN SUB-
8	MITTAL.—If, before the end of the 45-day period
9	specified in paragraph (1), the Director determines
10	that the assessment required by that paragraph can-
11	not be submitted by the end of that period as re-
12	quired by that paragraph, the Director shall (before
13	the end of that period) submit to the appropriate
14	committees of Congress a report setting forth-
15	(A) the reasons why the assessment cannot
16	be submitted by the end of that period; and
17	(B) an estimated date for the submittal of
18	the assessment.
19	(c) COMPREHENSIVE STRATEGY ON THREAT OF
20	MANPADS ORIGINATING FROM LIBYA.—
21	(1) STRATEGY REQUIRED.—The President shall
22	develop and implement, and from time to time up-
23	date, a comprehensive strategy, pursuant to section
24	11 of the Department of State Authorities Act of
25	2006, to reduce and mitigate the threat posed to

1	United States citizens and citizens of allies of the
2	United States from man-portable air-defense sys-
3	tems that were in Libya as of March 19, 2011.
4	(2) REPORT REQUIRED.—
5	(A) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 45 days
6	after the assessment required by subsection (b)
7	is submitted to the appropriate committees of
8	Congress, the President shall submit to the ap-
9	propriate committees of Congress a report set-
10	ting forth the strategy required by paragraph
11	(1).
12	(B) ELEMENTS.—The report required by
13	this paragraph shall include the following:
14	(i) An assessment of the effectiveness
15	of efforts undertaken to date by the United
16	States, Libya, Mauritania, Egypt, Algeria,
17	Tunisia, Mali, Morocco, Niger, Chad, the
18	United Nations, the North Atlantic Treaty
19	Organization, and any other country or en-
20	tity (as determined by the President) to re-
21	duce the threat posed to United States citi-
22	zens and citizens of allies of the United
23	States from man-portable air-defense sys-
24	tems that were in Libya as of March 19
25	2011.

1	(ii) A timeline for future efforts by
2	the United States, Libya, and neighboring
3	countries to—
4	(I) secure, remove, or disable any
5	man-portable air-defense systems that
6	remain in Libya;
7	(II) counter proliferation of man-
8	portable air-defense systems origi-
9	nating from Libya that are in the re-
10	gion; and
11	(III) disrupt the ability of terror-
12	ists, non-state actors, and state spon-
13	sors of terrorism to acquire such man-
14	portable air-defense systems.
15	(iii) A description of any additional
16	funding required to address the threat of
17	man-portable air-defense systems origi-
18	nating from Libya.
19	(iv) A description of technologies cur-
20	rently available to reduce the susceptibility
21	and vulnerability of civilian aircraft to
22	man-portable air-defense systems, includ-
23	ing an assessment of the feasibility of
24	using aircraft-based anti-missile systems to
25	protect United States passenger jets.

1	(v) Recommendations for the most ef-
1	fective policy measures that can be taken
2	
3	to reduce and mitigate the threat posed to
4	United States citizens and citizens of allies
5	of the United States from man-portable
6	air-defense systems that were in Libya as
7	of March 19, 2011.
8	(vi) Such recommendations for legisla-
9	tive or administrative action as the Presi-
10	dent considers appropriate to implement
11	the strategy required by paragraph (1).
12	(C) FORM.—The report required by this
13	paragraph shall be submitted in unclassified
14	form, but may include a classified annex.
15	(d) APPROPRIATE COMMITTEES OF CONGRESS DE-
16	FINED.—In this section, the term "appropriate commit-
17	tees of Congress" means—
18	(1) the Committee on Armed Services, the
19	Committee on Foreign Relations, and the Select
20	Committee on Intelligence of the Senate; and
21	(2) the Committee on Armed Services, the
22	Committee on Foreign Affairs, and the Permanent
23	Select Committee on Intelligence of the House of
24	Representatives.
