Biosecurity Education for Biology Researchers



The Federation of American Scientists is currently developing an interactive teaching module to promote awareness of biosecurity issues among bioscience researchers.



FAS received a grant from the Carnegie Corporation of New York to develop and implement a teaching module that will educate bioscientists about security in the reserach environment and dual-use concerns. The module will be interactive and based on case studies. Once completed, the module will be provided to graduate programs.
