I hereby direct the National Security Council to prepare a comprehensive review of J. . policy toward South frica. This review should include in a sessment of the situation in South Africa and, insofar as it elates irectly to our south African policy, the souther African regio.

The review should be emplified no late than May 1, 1989. It should include policy prins/recommendations. It should also delineate any differences etween the trious agenties. At a minimum, the review should address the killing destions and issues:

What are the areas of special alies competence or leavership regarding this issue?

# PART II. Policy Options

## South Africa

- -- Should our strategy focus largely on South Africa or should it meld South Africa into a policy which it more oriented towards the region?
- -- Should United States Government Policy goals stress the elimination of aparata and creations? Should the United States Government establish specific targets regarding the aforementioned goals, e.g., the release of Nelson Mandela, the release of all political prisoners, the lifting of various forms of censorship, freedom of political and economic movement, and enhancement of black bargaining power? What should be the additional targets? (5)


